October Program with Norm New Date, New Time, New Place

Our first program at the new Homewood Senior's facility will feature NORM! No, not Norm Abram but Norm Ellis from West Alabama Woodworkers Association. (WAWA) (You may remember that Norm displayed a beautiful hutch in our show last year.)

Norm is a fine craftsman and a scholar. He will show slides of his work and discuss aspects of Craftsman style furniture. He also will demonstrate how he makes mortise and tenon joints, a primary component of the Craftsman and Shaker style.

Norm retired from Alabama as a professor of experimental psychology after 26 years. Prior to that he taught at Peabody College in Nashville. He retired in 1990 and began woodworking in a more serious vein. Over the last 13 years he has built about 8-10 pieces of mostly Craftsman style furniture a year. Most of it found its way into the homes of his five offspring. In his own words he says, "I try to build functional furniture, simple but hopefully attractive and, above all, durable."
