First, let's thank **Mike Key** and **Fred Baker** for sharpening our tools and sharing their sharpening skills with us at the last meeting!


I want to apologize for not showing the Marc Adams video as promised in September. Everything was ready except the projection equipment was not in working order ... maybe this month.

# Lumber for Sale

As we work toward our goal of building our own shop and meeting place, several of our members have made suggestions and donations. We are in awe of the most generous donation of **James Caldwell**. **Jim** very generously donated a stock pile of wood that he has been collecting over the past twenty years. At his request, the Guild is selling the wood with 90 percent of the proceeds going to the Guild Building Fund and 10 percent going to **Jim's** church.

**Charlie Ard** was given the task of moving the wood from the warehouse where it had been stored. Since he estimated that there was more than 2,000 board feet of lumber involved, Charlie called numerous members who got together a convoy of nine pick up trucks and moved the wood to **Charlie's** shop on 3808 2nd Avenue South.

Now the Guild has wood for sale at terrific prices. All those folks who helped move the mountain of wood got first shot at it since there was more wood than Charlie's shop could handle. (**Charlie** was trying really hard to finish his show entry just when this all occurred.) I'm not sure how much or what kind of wood is left but there was quite a variety from walnut, maple, and oak to bass wood and poplar. 


