SHOW TIME!!

Set up for our annual show is Saturday, October 20th at 10 AM at the Hoover Library, only two days after the October Guild meeting. Categories include:

- •Traditional furniture
- •Contemporary furniture
- •Wood turnings
- •Other

to be judged by skill levels of beginner, intermediate, advanced and masters.

There are also four open categories where all entries no matter what the skill level of the participant are judged together:

- Wood carvings
- Shop tools/jigs
- •Restoration/refinishing
- •Toys

The judge will evaluate items based on design, joinery, finish and difficulty.

Your items can also be submitted to "Display Only" with no judging if you so desire. You may enter an item in the show that has been entered in a previous show, but if it has won a ribbon in the past, it will be for "Display Only."

The show is located on the lower level of the Hoover Library with the theatre. You can drive up to the entrance at that level to facilitate loading and unloading your project (rear of library). Items should remain in place until Sunday, October 28th, when everything should be picked up starting at 2 PM.

If you cannot bring your piece during the set-up period, please contact **Paul Mancill** or **Dwight Hostetter** for assistance. Please limit items to be judged to no more than three per category. If you won a blue ribbon in a category in the past, please move up to the next level. Judging will be Monday the 22nd followed by a reception Monday evening from 6 PM to 8 PM.

Our show judge for 2008 is Ron Peyton of the Dogwood Institute in Atlanta. Ron is one of our Guild Patrons. Be sure to stop by and say hello to him at the reception and thank him for his support of the Guild.
