Kinetics in Wood, Wood That Moves

We have a unique opportunity this month, come and hear **John Morgan**


John Morgan has spent the past 28 years researching forms of kinetic woodwork. Early emulations of folk art whirligigs and animated toys evolved to hand cranked, automata. This pursuit, funded primarily through Morgan's vocation as a Professor of Design, is the passion that drives his creative research. His narrative product springs from a unique marriage of art, design, and engineering. In

addition to teaching at Auburn University John teaches kinetic sculpture classes at the Marc Adams School of Woodworking in Indiana.

Pieces from his limited editions have been shown in American Craft and American Woodworker magazines and have been exhibited in craft galleries and museums in the US, UK and Japan. He was awarded the Best of Show by the Wharton Esherick Museum's Toying with Wood exhibition and has received numerous purchase awards from the Arkansas Arts Center's Toys Designed by Artists. His automata is held by individual collectors across the US and is represented in corporate collections in the US and Japan.
