
John Lawson will talk to us about "Sharpening chisels (and maybe a plane iron)" at our September 18th Meeting

SHOW TIME APPROACHES

After the September Guild meeting there will be just about one month until time to set up for the 2008 AWG Annual Show. I hope that most of you are ready with your projects, although there is still time to get busy and add another item to those you have prepared already. The show will be organized as it has been for the last several years with four categories:

- •Traditional furniture
- •Contemporary furniture
- Wood turnings

•Other

Items may be entered in the above categories to be judged by **skill levels of beginner, intermediate, advanced and masters**. Note that the Other category is a "catch-all" category for items that just don't fit in any other category.

You may also enter items into one of the four open categories:

- Wood carvings
- Shop tools/jigs

•Restoration/refinishing

•Toys

This year we will have two judges, one for furniture and another for turnings. The judges will evaluate each item in each category / skill level based on design, joinery, finish and difficulty. You may also enter items for "Display Only" not to be judged. You may enter an item in the show that has been entered in a previous show, but if it has won a ribbon in the past, it will be for "Display Only."

We will start the show set up on Saturday, October 18th at 10 AM. The show is displayed in the Hoover Library Gallery, which is located on the lower level with the theatre. You can drive up to the entrance at that level to facilitate loading and unloading your project (rear of library). The display remains in place until Sunday, October 26th, when all items should be picked up starting at 2 PM.

If you cannot bring your piece during the set-up period, please contact **Paul Mancill** or **Mike Key** for assistance. Please limit items to be judged to no more than three per category. If you won a blue ribbon in a category in the past, consider moving up to the next level. Judging will be Monday the 20th.

We will have our usual reception on TUESDAY evening from 6 PM to 8 PM. Bring your family and friends. This is a great time to share with fellow woodworking enthusiasts as well.

We are expecting a great show this year! If you have not participated in the show in previous years, you are missing out on one of the highlights of the Guild. Not only does it give you an opportunity to show off your work, but also the fun and fellowship experienced as part of the week's activities is a big part of what the Guild is all about. Don't be left out, come and join in the fun.
