Among them is **Nick Cook** who will demonstrate turning pieces longer than the lathe bed -- such as bedposts and lamps.

There will also be other demonstrations of woodworking techniques other than turning. Barbecue will again be the food of choice and served for a nominal fee. Ice cream will also be provided, compliments of Woodcraft.

WOODWORKING EDUCATION CENTER (WEC)

The kitchen island has been sprayed with lacquer and assembled in the kitchen. The lumber for the top has been purchased and partially glued up. We hope the island will be completed by our first meeting at the WEC on April 18th.

Remaining work on the Walker-Turner band saw are the blade guard (several designs have been tried) and painting. Hopefully these will be done shortly.

The large 36" band saw was worked on at **Charlie Ard's** shop on March 28th. The motor mount was fabricated and installed with the motor. Wheel covers have been fabricated, thanks to **John Lawson**, and the lower one installed. We need to get the upper wheel cover and the belt drive unit installed and the saw moved to the "WEC".

We will need a lot of help when this saw is moved because it is extremely heavy. This thing was built back when things were made out of thick cast iron. The estimate is it will weigh about 2000 pounds.

We continue **"Tuesday at the WEC"** with good attendance. Our project is a "Side Table" designed by Kelly Mehler (nationally known woodworker). We had 10 members present last meeting and encourage other members to attend.

Thanks to the donation from **Glenn Phillips** (a former member that moved away) we have a projects bin at the "WEC". This is for storage of members' in progress projects. Projects can be stored in this bin and not have to taken home and then brought back.
