We have a unique opportunity this month, come and hear John Morgan

John Morgan has spent the past 28 years researching forms of kinetic woodwork. Early emulations of folk art whirligigs and animated toys evolved to hand cranked, automata. This pursuit, funded primarily through Morgan's vocation as a Professor of Design, is the passion that drives his creative research. His narrative product springs from a unique marriage of art, design, and engineering. In addition to teaching at Auburn University **John** teaches kinetic sculpture classes at the **Marc Adams School of Woodworking in Indiana**.

Pieces from his limited editions have been shown in <u>American Craft</u> and <u>American Woodworker</u> magazines and have been exhibited in craft galleries and museums in the US, UK and Japan. He was awarded the Best of Show by the Wharton Esherick Museum's Toying with Wood exhibition and has received numerous purchase awards from the Arkansas Arts Center's Toys Designed by Artists. His automata is held by individual collectors across the US..

WOODWORKING EDUCATION CENTER (WEC)

SawStop Table Saws: The two SawStop table saws were bought to protect all the members from getting fingers and other parts cut while sawing. In an eight month period we have had cartridges fired five times and only one of those (the first one) involved a finger touching the blade, the other four were mistakes or not thinking through the cutting process. If a finger or other part of the body is involved, SawStop will replace the cartridge at no cost to us. For all other causes we have to pay for new cartridges at approximately \$100 each. A couple of the other reasons for the firings has been metal touching the blade and wet wood touching the blade. The last 3 times a cartridge was fired happened in a 3 week period. I don't know if members are being careless because they know the protection is there, or just not thinking the process through. But for whatever reason this is costing too much. So please think through what you are going to do so that this doesn't keep happening.

The signs were delivered to the Boys Ranch on September 21st. They are to paint and install them. If they have any problem they will call us. The Thursday group is currently working on walking canes for sale at the upcoming Avondale craft show.

The dust collector is still working well, but just like any other equipment it needs some maintenance. Last Thursday the suction was down considerably and we found the filter was essentially clogged up. Once that was cleared the suction was back to normal. So what I am saying is that at least once a week someone needs to clear the filter. Since the flapper in the filter does not work you have to use the mallet and tap all around the filter, top to bottom.

The big band saw has a new ½ inch blade on it now and is cutting fine. The large blade has been sharpened and is available for installation if necessary.

One of the pulleys on the Delta lathe has broken. Luckily the service center had one in stock and it will be installed within the next few days.

We have a wide variety of lumber for sale at the WEC and at prices below anybody else in town. The species we have are: Red Oak, Soft Maple, Curly Maple, Ambrosia Maple, Mahogany, Cedar, Cherry and small amounts of some others. So if you buy from the guild you not only get a better price, but you also help the guild financially.
