Education Programs Update

One of the most ambitious classes ever attempted by the Guild is almost complete. After seven classes taught by more than a dozen instructors and assistants, the seventeen students known as "The Cabineteers" have successfully constructed a fantastic set of kitchen cabinets. The cabinets look great and will be a highlight of the soon to be constructed Habitat For Humanity house. Many, many thanks to everyone who assisted in this project.

News Flash!! We have recently been informed by Habitat that their original installation date of December 4th may be delayed until December 11th. We will contact all students and instructors when HFH gives us the final date. 2010 was a very busy year for the Guild's education programs. We began with a seminar in lathe techniques and followed that event with classes teaching the construction of Windsor Chairs, bandsaw boxes, boats, and cabinets. 2011 will be just as busy as we begin with a seminar led by **Joel Rago** who will demonstrate finishing products and methods. That seminar will be taught on Saturday January 22nd. The seminar will be followed later in January with a new class led by Mike Key that will teach the construction of a "Fred Baker style" workbench. You can sign up for either of those events at the January 15th Guild meeting. Then in March, we will host Marc Adams for a two day seminar. Watch for more details as Marc's seminar approaches.

What kind of class will then follow? What kind of class do you want? Several ideas are being discussed. If you have a class you would like to take, or more importantly, if you have a class you would consider teaching, please let Monta or me know.

Our sincerest thanks go to all the instructors and students who made these 2010 events possible. Continuing education is one of the primary goals of the Guild and there are great things yet to come. Have fun but be safe.

Best Of Show

This chess board and stand by **Nevin Newton** were chosen by attendees at the 2010 Alabama Woodworkers Fall Show as "**Best of Show**". The work of art is constructed of walnut, maple, purpleheart, yellowheart, lace,

cherry and ebony. According to **Nevin**, there are 1827 individual pieces of wood in the project.

Mr. Newton told this reporter "A great amount of the wood came from old furniture that people have thrown out. The center hub was turned on the new Powermatic lathe at the Guild's wood shop. The top was turned on another Powermatic lathe, same size, with the motor head reversed and turned off the end of the lathe. I also had the use of a floor tool rest."

"I got the Idea and design from a similar taller chess table made by Malcolm Tibbetts and shown in his book, "The Art of Segmented Wood Turning". "His book has taught me a lot of turning techniques and ways to make designs" said **Nevin**."It took me four months to complete."
