Vice President **Dwight Hostetter** put together yet another fine meeting for us in March. **Bob Moore** demonstrated sharpening techniques using Japanese water stones to hone razor sharp edges on chisels and planning knives.

Bob was followed by **Billy Sims**, originally from east Tennessee, who demonstrated his interpretations of traditional styles of basket weaving from various regions, including the Southern Highlands, the Northeast, and the South Carolina low country. The materials, ranging from white oak and black ash to sweet grass and bull rush, were hand stripped from raw materials.





Education Director **Robert McClure** has been busy putting together seminars and training classes. The Marc Adams seminar was very well attended with over 30 members soaking up the variety of great ideas on furniture making and veneering. The seminar spanned two days and was chock full of useful information. Marc operates one of the premier woodworking schools in the United States and features only the finest woodworking instructors. This condition puts a strain on the motor and the belt. Please be careful when changing the speed on these lathes.

If you are interested in an item, place your bid on the sheet, but watch out for those competitors overriding your bid! The silent auction usually runs for about an hour with a lot of last second counter bids.

## **Education Activities Report**


