

You may recall that Joel taught our class on finishing and introduced many of us to just how easy spraying lacquer can be.

Speaking of the cabinets for Habitat for Humanity, a group of guys unloaded all the materials into the north room at the WEC last week. Please **DO NOT** use any of this material!!

Roughly, here is our plan for this year: Preston Lawley is going to coordinate the project along with Robert McClure. Bill Shivers is once again serving as the mas-

ter architect, ensuring that the drawings of the cabinets will result in working cabinets that actually fit in the kitchen and bathrooms.

Preston will be calling a series of "work days" over the next several months relying on the Guild members who taught various segments of the class last year to "oversee" the building of the component parts this year. This will not be a "class" and there will be no charge associated with participation in the cabinet building. We want to encourage all members to participate in as many work sessions as they like. We will begin with milling up the lumber for exact thickness. Then move to building the face-frames, the carcasses, doors, drawers, assembly and finishing. Lastly the cabinets will be installed in the Habitat for Humanity Christmas House sometime in December.



This is always a rewarding project and a learning experience for all levels of woodworkers.

### **August Meeting**

### Pre-meeting: Splint Wood Chair Seat Weaving -- Trav (Travis) Wilson --

Trav has been a member of AWG since 2007. He is the husband of Becca and the dad of Alexandra "Alex" (3-1/2) and Lucy Wilson (1-1/2). He is the pastor at Moody United Methodist Church in Moody, Alabama. He learned about chair seat weaving while refurbishing his great-grandmother's rocking chair in 2001. When he does get free time, he enjoys spending it with his family, but he also enjoys coming to the WEC to hang out with and learn from The Over the Hill Gang.

## Main Meeting: Wood Dust Hazards and How to Control it in the Home Workshop – Jerry Boling

Jerry Boling spent 27 years working for the Air Force with International Officers and in the area of Distance Learning. He retired eight years ago. He and his wife are avid hikers and have spent the last several summers day hiking into the back country in several mountainous areas of the country and Canada. When Jerry is not traveling, you can usually find him in his workshop. His primary interest is making furniture, usually out of cherry. His latest efforts are at learning to turn which got a real boost from the AWG turning workshop held recently.

Jerry has been very interested in working in a shop with clean air. His mother died of pulmonary fibrosis and two of her brothers died rather young ending their days on oxygen, so he has been motivated to minimize the risks with wood dust. He made his own cyclone and a filter box using CleanStream filters to recirculate the air back into the shop and has an air cleaner also which has been modified. He has recently acquired a Dylos DC1100 Pro Air Quality Monitor which has helped him make his dust collecting and air cleaning much more effective. He will be demonstrating the air quality monitor and relate it to the homemade versus commercially made dust collection systems.

Jerry will be telling us about hazards of wood dust to the skin and internally. He will be talking about the various forms of wood dust and what is done to control or contain them. He will focus on the dust that presents the most danger to our health by talking about settling rates and what is necessary to remove the most dangerous forms of dust. He will also take us on a little visual tour of his shop focusing on his cyclone and filter box, ductwork layout and his shop made blast gates. Jerry will also inform us about the use of galvanized sheet metal and pvc ductwork and what he did to make his system most effective. He will also touch on air cleaners and how to improve them. He even has some tips on how to make your contractor saw dust collection work below the level of the table.

Jerry doesn't claim to be an expert, but he has spent considerable time and effort on the Internet studying the problem of controlling wood dust plus he has practical experience in making a cleaner and safer shop.

### Woodworking Education Center (WEC)

The stock of "Red Wood" lumber has been replenished and the price has even been reduced.

We still need your help with getting the projects rack cleaned up and lets try to keep it as clear as possible.

We are still having some problems with the Grizzly drum sander. What I have seen is the same thing that has always happened. Mainly the person using the sander is not following the instructions on the machine. In addition be aware of the following:

- \* Do not use a metal hammer when installing the clips (this is damaging the drums )
- \* Do not use the sander to clean up your glue joints (scrape the joint to remove the glue before running through the sander). If you don't the glue will stick to the sandpaper and will not clean off with a gum cleaner.
- \* Do not use the old strip of paper as a template for the new strip ( the old one has probably stretched or the ends torn off).
- \* You should never take a larger bite than 1/8 of a turn on the lowering crank and it should be even less for wide boards. I remind you again this is a sander and not a planer.

We are wasting a lot of this sandpaper which is fairly expensive.

We have had an incident over the last couple of weeks where the Dust Control filters in the closet were full of dust and practically running over. It was obvious the filters had not been serviced for some time. I know they are in the closet and it is easy to forget but they have to be taken care of. They should be cleaned at least once a week and more often if the equipment is used heavily. If you use the equipment then it is your responsibility to see that these filters are cleaned just like it is your responsibility to clean up after yourself including emptying the dust control drum outside.


