Pat Bush spent a lot of time recently organizing things at the WEC. Please help by putting things back where they belong when finished using them.



Birmingham Builds in Haiti: Jimmy & Rosalynn Carter Work Project 2011

Earlier this month, members of Habitat Birmingham's staff and Board of Directors joined President and Mrs. Carter in Léogâne, Haiti, for Habitat for Humanity's 28th annual Jimmy & Rosalynn Carter Work Project.

During weeklong build, 500 volunteers from around the world helped to build 100 homes in partnership with earthquake-affected families in Léogâne, a city 18 miles west of Port-au-Prince and near the epicenter of the 2010 7.0-magnitude earthquake.

Since the beginning of the year, Habitat has donated its scrap wood from a warehouse in the west end, where volunteers pre-build window and door casings for future Habitat homes. Leftover wood from those activities has been gathered and provided to the Guild.

Throughout the year, twenty members of the Guild joined forces each Friday at the Woodworkers Education Center in Maylene. They had one goal in mind: to help bring joy to kids receiving treatment at Children's Hospital.

Thanks to the constant supply of Habitat's wood, the members crafted a record-breaking donation for Children's – 8,616 toys. The donation is comprised of 4,185 cars, 2,002 boxes, 340 stools, and 350 helicopters among hundreds of other items guaranteed to bring smiles to thousands of young faces.

The service opportunity brings joy to more than the kids, however. New Guild member Paul Shank commented that "Friday mornings were the happiest part of my year."




