Guild Christmas Party



Summary

Paul Revere Project for The American Village



The Alabama Woodworkers Guild (AWG) donated their time in completing several program sets for the Paul Revere Program's educational mission. The work consisted of the following items:

- 1. 20 building cutouts with braces and trim
- 2. One cutout of the "Old North Church" with brace and trim
- 3. One cutout of the "Provincial Powder House" with brace and trim
- Six free standing trees
- Three directional sigh posts with bases
- Six sign posts with bases
- 7. One row boat, on casters, with lantern support post for crossing the Charles River

The work was performed in the AWG's shop between 9/15/11 and 12/1/11. Thirteen members of the Guild participated. Eight of the 13 worked on 5 or more of the 10 primary work sessions. Approximately 450 man-hours were expended toward the project. The Guild considers it one of its best community


Thanks to Tim and all who have gone before and are willing to share their experience and knowledge with others.


