Each box will be decorated for either a boy or a girl . No poinsettias this year. Can't ever give them all away. A Christmas card per table...and away we go. Tracey and I will cover the shipping costs of the shoe boxes (\$7 per box) to Samaritan's Purse.

The list of items desired and NOT are below.

Desired:

- Toothbrush / Tooth Paste
- Comb and/or Brush
- Soaps (no liquids)
- Washcloths
- Hair Accessories (pony tail holders, clips, hair barettes)
- Hard Candy
- School Supplies (pens, pencils, paper, notepads, crayons, markers)
- Craft supplies (stickers and sticker books, coloring books)
- Small toys / Small stuffed animals / balls (nothing they can swallow)
- Clothing (t-shirts, socks, flip flops)
- Small flashlights (include batteries)
- Sunglasses

Do NOT bring:

- Toy guns or toys of a violent nature
- Liquids (no shampoos. mouthwash, bubbles)
- Drinks or perishable food items
- Cookies or Chocolates

Half of the boxes will be donated to Shelby Baptist Association (large local charity to persons of all / no faith) and half to Samaritan's Purse (International Organization in multiple countries). Each table will have a shoe box (boy or girl) and at the appropriate time, they will either put their items in their box or the gender appropriate box on another table if their item is the wrong gender for the shoebox on their table

Everyone bring two small items. People with last names A-M bring one (1) boy item, N-Z bring one (1) girl item...plus everyone bring a neutral item (crayon, pencils). Less than 10 dollars, probably less than 6 dollars should buy both items.




Pepper Mill Class


