Alabama Woodworkers Guild Annual Toy Donation




If you are looking at some puzzle pieces scattered across a table top they do not make sense or form anything recognizable. But if these pieces are positioned in just the right way, they all come together to form a complete picture. This year the puzzle pieces all came together to form a wonderful picture. That picture this year was of thousands of kids with smiles on their faces as they received handmade wooden toys while spending time at Children's Hospital.

The puzzle pieces came from many different places and represent many dedicated people.

The pieces are;

- those that started this whole toy program thing many years ago,
- donated equipment to make the toys,
- financial donations for materials (axle pegs, dowels and wheels, wheels),
- over four tons of donated wood,
- hundreds of hours spent making sawdust and wooden toys,
- 20 to 30 people willing to make a difference in a child's life.



The toys came from not only the WEC but also from the individual shops of many of the Guild's members. The toys came by the dozens, by the hundreds, even by the thousands. They came from big shops, little shops, well equipped, elaborate shops and simple shops. They came in each week and each month. They came to make big smiles on more little faces than at any time in our past.

This year the number of toys topped 14,500 but the more important count is the number of smiles on the faces of the recipients. The toys will give long hours of joy during play time but will also make shorter the long hours of time spent in a place away from home, in Children's Hospital.

Thank you Guild members, thank you Toys Group members, thank you everyone that drew, cut, sanded, drilled, routed, or assembled. Thank you Greater Birmingham Habitat for Humanity. Thank you Birmingham READS AmeriCorps. Thank you generous patrons. This has been a tre-

mendous large group effort – the families and the kids are the beneficiaries of these efforts.

What a beautiful scene these puzzle pieces have come together to make!



Go 2.1 miles on Highway 12 until it ends at County Highway 17. Turn right on Highway 17 and the WEC is 0.3 miles on your left. There is a large WEC sign at the entrance.


