He believes that understanding the history of furniture, the wood being used, and the region where a piece is made is just as important as the fundamentals of making a quality piece.

Project: Alabama Sheriffs Boys Ranch Tables

When Alabama Sheriffs Boys Ranch of St. Clair County Director, Anita Thompson, recognized the need to replace the 40+ year old dining tables in one of the cottages, she reached out to the Alabama Woodworkers Guild for help. The Guild has a long history with the Boys Ranch where Guild members have worked on several projects including the building of study desks and beds, and helping remodel kitchen cabinets and spruce up the place with painting. The Guild also built the Boys Ranch signage as well as conducted a session where the boys were mentored on building Blue Bird houses. Building a couple of dining tables was a perfect way to provide some quality time for members and to give back to the community, a win-win opportunity from any viewpoint.

The task at hand was to build dining tables that together would fit into the oversized Dining Room of the Beeson House. More than just for dining, it is a gathering place for the boys and house parents to work together on homework or group games. Project Lead Bill Shivers afforded the opportunity to the Guild and gathered up volunteers to design, build and deliver the finished tables to the Boys Ranch.





The Boys Ranch was fortunate to have another benefactor, the BE&K Alumni Association, who donated chairs to complete the project. The chairs provided a target to aim for as the table color and finish was selected.

The Woodworking Educational Center became a beehive of activity this past April; Guild members met, custom plans were drawn and lumber was shaped to specifications. The table tops were cut to size, oak planking sized making up the table skirts and edging, and bonded together in preparation of tapered legs strong enough to withstand the daily use of the boys of the Ranch. Experienced hands and newcomers alike joined together to bring the project together learning new techniques and helpful "tips" in shaping, joinery and finishing. Not to be outdone, our roaming Quality Control guru used a practiced eye and made sure all surfaces were sufficiently covered and drips were not to be found.

The tables were completed and caravanned to the Boys Ranch just after Easter. The House Parents, Bob and Carol Hensell, were delighted with the new tables and chairs which fit perfectly in the



spacious dining room. Guild members were treated to lunch of "Southern, Comfort Food" prepared by Anita and house parents Carol Hensell, Karen Hooks, and Lisa Whitwood. The day was a perfect ending to a perfect project.


2014 Guild Orientation

From 1-65, take Exit 238 (Highway 31). Turn north on U.S. Highway 31, go 0.6 miles and turn left on State Highway 119 South. Go 3.0 miles south on Highway 119 and turn right on County Highway 12. Go 2.1 miles on Highway 12 until it ends at County Highway 17. Turn right on Highway 17 and the WEC is 0.3 miles on your left. There is a large WEC sign at the entrance.




Directions:
