# October Pre-Meeting Mentoring Topic: Sketch-Up-Digital 3D Design Tool

Our October Mentoring Series featured Guild Member and Craftsman Jeff Branch. Jeff shared with us the 3D Computer Modeling Design Tool: *SketchUp*. While SketchUp users include architects, designers and engineers, it allows even the most basic of woodworkers to be able to design and create their own projects.

Jeff shared what SketchUp is all about and how it can be used to create simple and easy to use project plans and documentation.



Jeff is an accomplished woodworker and maintains his own Blog: Jeff Branch Woodworking; where he tracks and offers free wood working plans. The Guild is working with Jeff to create detailed plans for next year's Habitat for Humanity Cabinet Build Class!



While SketchUp is a computer based tool, one does not have to have the internet up to use it. SketchUp has a free downloadable application called: <u>SketchUp Make</u>. Jeff showed the group some simple commands and how to navigate in the tool.





# Directions to the Woodworkers Education Center (WEC)



**From I-65**, take Exit 238 (Highway 31). Turn north on U.S. Highway 31, go 0.6 miles and turn left on State Highway 119 South. Go 3.0 miles south on Highway 119 and turn right on County Highway 12. Go 2.1 miles on Highway 12 until it ends at County Highway 17. Turn right on Highway 17 and the WEC is 0.3 miles on your left. There is a large WEC sign at the entrance.
