Bob will show us how to build a scaled down version of the Harvey Ellis design/Gustav Stickley #700 bookcase. The size is 42" tall, 24" wide, and 12"deep. The seminar will be Saturday April 9th and Sunday April 10th from 9:00am until 4:00pm at the Woodworking Education Center, 10544 Hwy. 17, Maylene, AL 35114.

The bookcase is made of quarter sawn white oak featuring through mortise and tenon joints and miter sawn dividers in the glass door. At the end of the class the bookcase that Bob made in the class will be raffled off to the

members of the class. After the class, we are planning to have a group bookcase build for the members of the class who want to make a bookcase of their own. There is no additional charge for this build, just the cost of materials.

In Memory of Frank Jones

was a founding member of the Alabama Woodworkers Guild and from its inception was supportive of Guild activities in every way, financially, with his time and energy, and his skill and knowledge. Frank was our mentor before we had a mentors program, for years he offered sessions in his shop for groups of one to four Guild members, teaching us the techniques for cutting dovetails, carving ball and claw feet, carving spoons and others skills. If you were lucky, you might be the only one there and have the privilege of his undivided atten-

tion for several hours. Frank was a very patient instructor, allowing you to move at a pace at which you were comfortable but willing to step in and hands on show you what you were doing wrong, once back on track return the item for you to duplicate what he had demonstrated. I know there are several of us who still have one ball and claw foot as a result of these classes. Frank's shop, on the lower level of his home, was not a large shop, but was the source of some beautiful woodwork projects. Two of his projects that stand out in my mind are a Maloof inspired rocking chair and a Bombay chest. Both were beautiful pieces of furniture with great detail and joinery.

A visit to Frank's home was always an adventure. He was an avid collector and you never knew which collection he would share with you. Regardless of which it might be, he shared it with joy and knowledge. You always left knowing more that when you came.

For many years, at any meeting, Frank would be found at the center of the front row, always participating, many times teaching. Even in his final wishes Frank's thoughts included the Guild by requesting contributions to the Guild in lieu of flowers. With the skill of a jeweler and the eye of an artist Frank contributed greatly to the success of the Guild.


