Your response to the idea of a woodworking guild is totally unbelievable. It has been a full time job just answering inquiries and sending information to those who are interested.

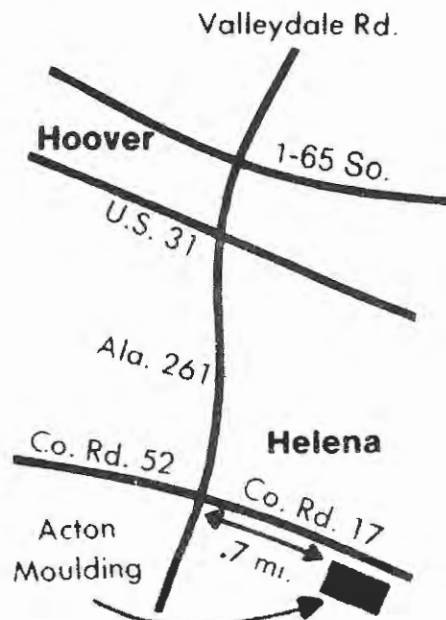

PROFILE -----

Temporary President Spruce McRee

Spruce was born in Birmingham and attended Mt. Brook public schools and Samford University. Upon graduation from Samford in 1972, Spruce worked with the FBI in Washinton, D.C. In 1974, Spruce returned to Birmingham to accept a job with Liberty National, where he is now a sales manager. Spruce and his wife, Georgeann, have two sons, Patrick and Christopher.

Spruce's woodworking interest began on his 15th birthday when he received some power tools. Some of Spruce's larger woodworking projects have included enclosing a

carport for a den and adding a 16 x 24 foot workshop to his house. Of special interest to Spruce is building furniture and clocks. He has built such items as grandfather clocks, mantle clocks and wall clocks. Spruce has also built bunkbeds, drysinks, bookcases, gun cases, fernstands, chests of drawers, hutches, and a children's sized round oak table with four chairs. His latest project is a very detailed mahogany cabinet with shelves and drawers.

Spruce's woodworking equipment includes a Rockwell 10 inch table saw and shaper, a DeWalt radial arm saw, a Powermatic joiner, 14 inch bandsaw and a Craftsman drill press.

As can be seen Spruce is very active in woodworking and should provide valuable leadership to the Guild.

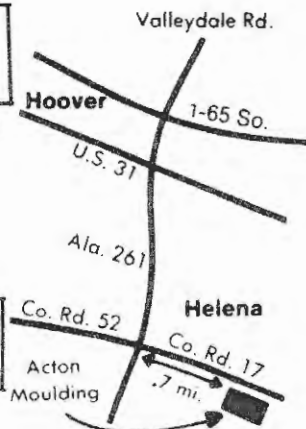
