Our thanks to Leonard Sanders for a great demonstration on lathe turning. As well as being a pretty fair turner, he's a pretty good comedian, too.











**OUT-OF-SIGHT NAILING** 




#### Out-of-sight nailing

Sometimes a filled nail hole stands out worse than a moose in a phone booth.

#### TIP:

Hide that nail by using a sharp, narrow chisel or gouge to lift and turn back a small shallow flap of wood with the grain. Experiment on a piece of scrap of the same material first. Drive the nail inside the resulting cavity and set it. Glue and clamp the lifted section in its original position.
