We have a very timely subject for our meeting this month. We have had several of our members have an accident in their shops, some mild, some serious and some very serious. Your Board believes it is time for a program on safety and has arranged for several of our members who have had accidents to tell us about them in hopes the rest of us may be forewarned to the extent we won't repeat any of their unfortunate accidents. Dr. Hal Skalka will speak on eye safety; Wallace Williams will tell us about his encounter with a band saw; President Dan will warn us of the dangers of using a router; and Mike Key may come and share with us his accident. None of us wants to become a statistic in our

woodworking shop so why not at least learn a little about safety and maybe keep all of our fingers or whatever.

Last Meeting-August, 1999

The first thing new to greet us was a 48" space fan blowing on us mortals. The fan was purchased from a garage sale Bill West knew about and paid for one-half each by our Guild and the Woodturners (who meet at Bo's also). Our program was brought by Tom Crawford who designs and sells canoes and rowboats. He got started by bringing to Boy Scouts a "do it yourself" program of building your own boat from plans and materials supplied by him. Then the kits became popular, and he now sells them to any and everyone who wants one. Each Thursday night at 6:30 at HQ on Hwy. 150 in Hoover classes are held to build your boat. These canoes are "stitch and glue" construction. Wooden strips, 1/4" x 3/4", thirty-one to each side are bent around a mold, or form, the edges covered with glue and then stitched together. The stitching is done by drilling tiny holes through which small wires (metal) are fed and pulled tight, thus the stitching.

When the glue has dried, the stitches are removed and the holes are filled. Next comes fiberglass cloth covered with three coats of epoxy which is scraped down smooth with regular paint or wood scrapers. The boats are made from basswood, western red cedar and fir. If you are interested in attending or just observing a class, call HQ at 733-1550 to be sure the class will be held that Thursday night. Thank you, Tom.


