
Charlie also brought his lathe with a wooden lathe bed. This one is a bit lighter and Charlie is able to disassemble it to take to guild demonstrations and the like.

To get to Frank Jones's shop take I-65 South to Exit 247, Valleydale Road, turn right and follow Valleydale Road across Hwy 31 and past 84 Lumber.

It is 8.2 miles from 84 Lumber to Frank's Driveway.

Somewhere along the way the road name changes to Helena Road and keeps going right on through Helena and becomes Hwy 17. You will go past the intersection with Hwy 52.

When you pass Ronnie Acton's place you are one mile north of Frank's driveway. There is a mailbox on the road with Frank Jones's name on it. Turn there and follow the road.
