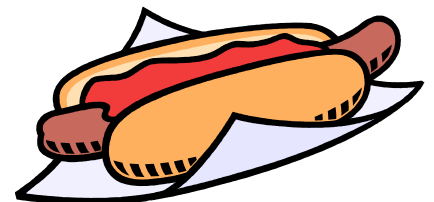

## Alabama Woodworkers Guild Scholarship Program April 15, 2004

The following program was voted on and approved by the general membership on April 15, 2004.

### Program Name

The program is to be referred to as "Alabama Woodworkers Guild Scholarship Program."

### Funding

The program will be funded from the general budget of the Guild. One thousand dollars will be allocated to fund the program in 2005 and adjusted as appropriate by the BOD at the January meeting of each of the following years.

In 2004 five hundred dollars will be allocated at the July meeting for awards during the remainder of the year. In the following years, half of the annual budget will be allocated for awards in January and half will be allocated in July.

### Management

The BOD will appoint a member to serve as the Scholarship Program Administrator. The administrator will be responsible to receive scholarship applications for presentation to the BOD, keep records as needed, and request the Treasurer to issue payments as approved by the BOD.

**Bill Shivers** was appointed as the initial administrator.

### Eligibility

To be eligible to receive a scholarship the member must have been an active member of the Guild for twelve months and have renewed his or her membership for their second year.

Guild sponsored seminars are not eligible for these scholarships.

### Awards

Awards will be considered for any course related to improving one's woodworking skills and offered by a recognized organization involved in promoting woodworking.

Any funds not awarded during a period may be carried forward to future periods.

Members may apply for a scholarship equal to 50% of the tuition cost of the course, not to exceed \$200.

Awards will be made on a "first come" basis to the extent funds are available. The time and date of the postmark or the time and date the application is handed

to the administrator is the basis for the "first come".

A member may not receive more than one scholarship during a calendar year.

The scholarship will be paid to the recipient upon completion of the course and presentation of a paid receipt from the teaching organization.

The Scholarship Program Administrator will be responsible to maintain all records for the program.

### Application

Applications are to be submitted on the attached form. It may either be mailed to the Guild's post office box or it may be delivered to the Administrator.

Applications must be submitted to the Scholarship Program Administrator within six weeks after the start of the course.

### Obligations

The recipient is obligated to write an article for the newsletter describing and critiquing the course. And, as a supplement to our meetings, they are obligated to instruct the Guild in the learned skills at a pre-meeting or regular meeting program.
