Then, June 11 will be our second seminar of the year featuring Kenton Hall, a woodworker and professor at Ball State in Muncie IN. Kenton will discuss and demonstrate how woodworkers in the past used varying moisture content in wood to keep joints tight. He will demonstrate how he uses jigs, hand tools and shop tools to build a simple chair. This should be a very interesting and informative seminar so please attend if possible. **Mike Key** has agreed to keep a roster for attendees and the tuition will be \$60 so sign up at the next meeting.

April '05 Meeting Program

Cliff Daniels will discuss the scroll saw at our April meeting.

Without question, **Cliff** is one of our Guild's most accomplished woodworkers. He is mostly self-taught. While **Cliff** has been a woodworker most of his life, he became more serious about twenty years ago and, after joining the Guild in the early 90's, he was truly inspired by what he saw and learned in this group.

His most recent award was "Best of Show" in our juried showing last November for the "23 Psalm" done with a scroll saw.

In the early summer **Cliff** will teach a series of Saturday classes on the scroll saw. At our meeting he will discuss the different aspects of the saw, accessories, and supplies and show examples of what can be accomplished with the saw.

Kenton Hall Seminar June 11

The Guild board was fortunate to get a preview of Kenton Hall's presentation at the April board meeting. As Kenton Hall showed us pictures of his work, one is struck by how with one foot firmly planted in the past the other stretches far into the future. Kenton is fascinated by the old world art that allowed furniture makers to create joinery that is beautifully tight after a hundred years. He has spent a great deal of time in the north east studying techniques of the past great master furniture makers. Yet his work has a futuristic feel.

As an instructor at Ball State University, Kenton encourages his students to venture to the very edges of their imaginations and look into the future to create new unique creative designs. His students, even those who had never before done woodworking, create interesting, new furniture pieces. His seminar is sure to be thought provoking and inspiring. The class will concentrate on chair making and creating those joints that should be tight in a hundred years. Kenton says that the secret to those tight joints is understanding the affects of moisture on wood and manipulating it to your advantage.

Shane Carter and **Jim Lee** have very graciously invited us to once again use their shop for the seminar. It will be held on **June 11 from 8:00 AM until 4:00 PM**. The workshop is a bargain at \$60 and will include lunch. **Mike Key** will be taking reservations at our April meeting. Please make plans to attend.

Cliff Daniels' Scroll Saw Class Begins June 18th

TAX EXEMPT STATUS

We have received notice that Alabama Woodworkers Guild, Inc. has been determined to be an exempt organization under Section 501 ©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and further granted the status of a public charity.

Having received this status, contributions to the Guild are now qualified tax deductions. We are also qualified to receive tax-deductible bequests, devises, transfers or gifts. Having this status should help us with any fund raising effort that the Guild undertakes in the future. In the past, solicitations have been limited to businesses or individuals who could deduct contributions as business expenses or who were willing to make the contribution without regard to any tax deduction. With the tax-exempt charity status, most contributions of money, property or services to the Guild are deductible.

We will be preparing receipt forms to be used to acknowledge contributions that will be available for members to use when soliciting contributions of money or property as we take advantage of these new benefits available to us to provide additional services, programs and educational opportunities to Guild members and the general public.


