Federal Style Card Table Class

Our table class continues. So far we have built our half-round table aprons, cut our own veneer and applied it to the aprons using a vacuum press, created the wooden knuckle hinged back piece that allows the rear legs to swivel, and begun to work on the tapered legs.

With **John Lawson** as our leader (shown checking the band-saw table for square), we are making eight tables. We have experienced several problems and addressed them along the way. Currently we are working on dovetailing the back rail to the table apron. We complete some of the projects in class and then **John** assigns us home work. When we get stuck he lets us come by his and **Jim's** shop for special help and pointers.



Buzz and I were recently at the Marc Adams School to take a decorative details class from Steve Latta (who built the original table featured on the cover of Fine Woodworking that inspired our class). The Marc Adams School will be offering a class on building this same table. However, the cost will be a lot steeper than the \$85 we paid. I constantly marvel at what terrific bargains the Alabama Woodworkers Guild classes are.

I think the lesson on squaring our band saw table to the saw blade was worth the cost of tuition. You wouldn't believe what nice thin veneer slices we were able to make after **John** showed us how to square the table.

I thought you might enjoy seeing some of the pictures of our progress so far. Class participants are **Baron Bartlett, Brian Stauss, Mike Key, Chuck Williams, Buzz** and myself.
