Pre-meeting demonstration on sharpening and using cabinet scrapers presented by Walter Barnett

Veneering with John Lawson

John Lawson, one of our own extremely talented members, will present our July program. **John** is an industrial engineer by education. He spent most of his career in manufacturing of automotive parts. He and his wife, Jeanne, have three children and have lived in the Birmingham area for the past 8 years. **John** started woodworking about 20 years ago but about five years ago he started to woodwork in earnest. If you remember his table in the 2005 show you understand what I mean by "in earnest." **John** shares a shop with **Jim Lee** and they do all types of woodworking. **John** has a special interest in 18th century American furniture. One of the things **John** told me that he has learned over the years that "if you have an open mind and patience you can do pretty good work."

Come early and get a front row seat to see how veneering is done and used in furniture making.

Those members in attendance were asked to look the list over and identify any with whom there might be an opportunity for us to network.

There were 11 individuals who thought they might have an opportunity to network with 24 organizations/individuals on the list. Of those 24 organizations/individuals, there were 21 different organizations/individuals. We need a better response! If those members who were not at the meeting responded in the same ratio, then we would have the needed number of contacts. I will, again, have a copy of the list at our next meeting and I will ask those who have not reviewed the list to please get a copy from me and look it over. We need your help.

Sharpen and Use Cabinet Scrapers: Our Pre-meeting Demo

Our July pre-meeting demo will be presented by Walter Barnett. He will demonstrate how to sharpen and use a cabinet scraper.

If you are like me, you have a couple of these scrapers lying around and use them occasionally to clean up a glue joint or some simple task. There are many uses for this simple but effective tool.

Walter will show us how and when to use the scraper. He will also demonstrate the method he uses for sharpening his scrapers...and maybe even help you to sharpen yours if you bring it with you to the meeting. Remember that the pre-meeting demo starts at 5:30 PM in our regular meeting room.

Woodworking Center Fund Update

Pledges for The Woodworking Center continue to come in. Thirty-one members have donated and/or pledged a total of \$32,647. Adding our CD's and unpaid pledges, we now have a total of \$47,496 set aside for our Woodworking Center. Last January when this program was presented to the membership, the support was almost unanimous. While the fundraising has gone very well, It is disappointing that only 25% of our members have made a pledge -- there are a number of us "who have not put our money where our mouth is." If you have any questions or reservations about making your pledge, any of your officers or BOD members are prepared to answer them.

Our most significant benchmark for measuring how successful our planning and fundraising has been is to compare us to the Greenville Guild. They raised \$50,000 in about one year to open their shop -- we are \$2500 shy of that in six months. Our goals, however, are different from theirs -- they only have a shop, without space for regular meetings. Their membership has tripled in the last three years and now they are planning for a new 18,000 sq ft facility that meets all their needs -- we are planning to have a facility to meet all our needs in the first step.

Greenville has been very supportive by sharing all of their costs and other information with us. This data has been very helpful and gives us great confidence in what we are doing.


