→ Directions to the Alabama Sheriff's Boys Ranch

- From Birmingham take I-20 east towards Atlanta to Exit 147.
- At the bottom of exit turn right (see the big Chevron station on left) and go a short distance (about .2 mile) and turn left on US 78 E.
- Follow US 78 E about 2 miles and turn right on Camp Winnataska Road.
- Follow Camp Winnataska Road 3/10 mile. Turn right on Cherokee Rd. (Little church on the corner).
- Follow Cherokee Rd 4.5 miles (seems like more). Boys Ranch is on the right. Turn in. Pass the log cabin office and a big sign identifying the Ranch. Follow road past two homes, turn right, up the hill leading to the third home. At top of hill you will see the gym straight ahead. We meet there.
- It will take 35 to 40 minutes from the airport to get there. If you get lost call 405 – 6455.
- Note – Do NOT follow the directions on Mapquest

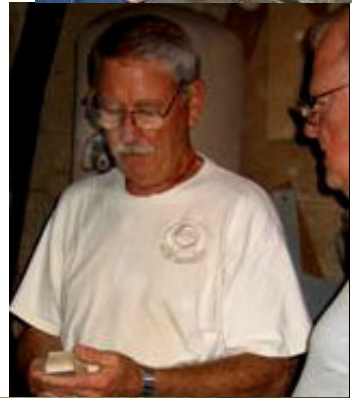
