The Woodstock Festival Art Center: One Man's Vision



It is the goal of Richard Hinson at Woodstock Festival Art Center to provide a venue for local artists of all kinds to perform and exhibit their work as well as to bring great opportunities to the community of Woodstock and the surrounding areas. To that end, he created a monthly event called Market Day. This indoor/outdoor event gives artists and crafters an opportunity to sell their wares in a craft fair setting while musicians perform on the WFAC stage.

Richard Hinson grew up in Demopolis, Alabama and graduated from the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa in 1980 with a degree in accounting. He came to the sleepy rural town of Woodstock, Alabama to run a building supply company in 2001 which, eight years later, evolved into his present business, Cabins & Covers.

One morning in 2011, as he was looking off the balcony of his upstairs residence in the cavernous warehouse located behind the business office of C&C, Hinson had something of an epiphany. The huge facility could be made into a venue for local artists and musicians, perhaps even writers, to come and sell their wares, promote their business and provide culture and entertainment to the tri-county area. During Richard's years in Woodstock, he had come to know many artisans, craftspeople and musicians so there was no question that "The Woodstock Festival Art Center" could fit that bill. While he was at it, why not provide a facility in which to teach art and music to the children and adults in the area who would not have that opportunity otherwise? Thus, began the non-profit organization that Hinson named, "The Woodstock Cultural Art Foundation."

So, in the fall of that year, he presented the very first Market Day weekend. The empty, dreary old warehouse was suddenly transformed into a lively marketplace with hand crafted items such as textiles, goat milk soap, jewelry and gleaming hand-turned wood. There was also room for vendors with trusted, well-established companies such as Avon and Scentsy. The two indoor markets at the end of that year were very successful.



In May of this year, Hinson changed the format to an indoor/outdoor, one day festival

on the second Saturday of every month, adding extra attractions such as car shows and a kid's area with balloons and face-painting. New vendors have been added as well, with items like fresh produce, Amish goods and a Hot Mini Donut truck. Also on Market Day, musicians from many different genres take to the brand new stage at one end of the warehouse to entertain the crowd.

So, what else has Hinson got up his sleeve you may ask? Well, what else is the area sorely in need of? FOOD! Opening soon is The Junction Café, also located inside the center. He plans to have a "meat & 3" type lunch menu to begin with; eventually including a dinner service with grilled steaks and barbeque.

Woodstock is conveniently located between Birmingham and Tuscaloosa. Just down the road from Tannehill State Park, Splash Adventure Park and just up the road from the Mercedes Plant and the University of Alabama. The Woodstock Festival Art Center is, as yet, a largely undiscovered gem on Hwy 11 just off I 20/59 west at exit 97; but, if Richard Hinson has his way, it will not be for very much longer.
