SPRAY FINISHING CLASS WITH MARTY SCHLOSSER

One of the great benefits of belonging to the Alabama Woodworkers Guild is the opportunity to attend a class taught by a renowned individual in that field. The Spray Finishing Class taught by Marty Schlosser which I recently took at the WEC is a great example of what I am talking about.

Marty Schlosser is a longtime friend of the AWG. He has been designing, making, and finishing furniture for nearly 50 years. Marty conducts spray finishing workshops in Toronto, Canada and writes blogs for Fugi Spray (which are full of valuable information). His home is in Canada, but he will vacation on the Gulf Shore for several weeks during the winter months. During this time, Marty will visit the AWG to be the Program Speaker at one of our monthly meetings to share his knowledge, do a demonstration, or teach a class.

Personally, most of my prior experience with spray painting was using a prepackaged metal can with a button on top. So, I was a little concerned that I might quickly become overwhelmed in a class lead by someone of Marty Schlosser's caliber. My concerns quickly dissipated. Marty was able to cover a lot of information in an easily understandable way. With frequent reminders that personnel protection is paramount, Marty talked about and showed us, what seemed to me, everything you possibly would need to know about spray guns and the liquids you sprayed through them. When it came to the "hand's on" portions of the class, Marty would: **Tell** us what to do, **Show** us what to do, and **Let** us do it. Then under Marty's watchful eyes, he would guide us on how to improve what we were doing.



This was a 3-day class which I feel went far beyond the basis. From how to properly prepare the wood's surface, to talking about sanding sealer, dyes, stains, lacquers, varnishes, to how to determine the viscosity of the fluid (and what to do with that information), how to achieve correct spray pattern, to the proper way to move the spray gun, and to cleaning your spray gun. Of course, there was more things covered but you get the gist, he covered a lot of information and we got to do some to spray painting!

As a huge bonus, through Marty's connections, Fuji Spray, Target Coatings, and Inest Awata sponsored this class with their donation of the equipment and products we used in this class to AWG. The value of these donations is over 3 thousand dollars, which the Guild was allowed to keep.

The Spray Finishing Class was a great class that I am so glad I had the opportunity to take. I learned a lot more than I thought I would. So, when the next Master Class is offered in an area of woodworking you are interested in, I strongly recommend that you take it.

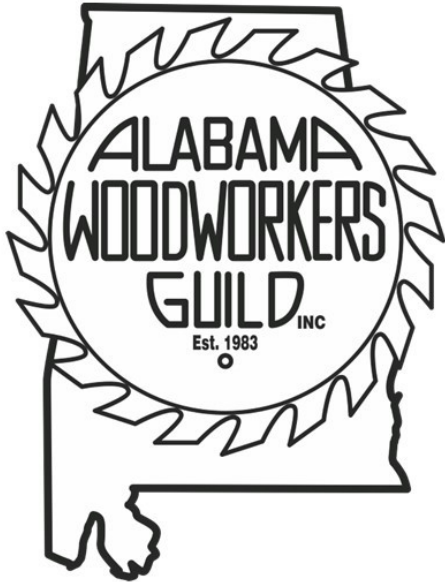
