

Intro to Scrolling

The second beginner scroll saw class was held on Saturday August 3, 2024. After receiving feedback from my first class, I decided to extend the class to a full day.

We began class by learning a little bit of the history of scrolling and then moved on to learning about the saw and how it works. We also discussed blades, patterns and wood preparation.

After some practice exercises, each student made the "famous" oven buddy. The budding wood artists were then given a choice of 3 patterns to try after lunch. Everyone

went home with two projects, a dozen blades and information on resources for patterns and supplies.

I always enjoy sharing this neat skill with fellow woodworkers and I

think the students enjoyed learning about this versatile skill. I am planning on devel-

oping a more advanced class to further challenge my student's scrolling skills.
