Some exciting news, we have acquired a new drum sander to replace the old Jet drum sander that has been out of commission for several weeks. The new sander is a Baileigh SD 255, which provides up to a 25 inch cut. This new sander will be available for general shop use shortly. We will require training on the new sander to ensure proper use as it is a little different than the old equipment.

#### CNC/LASER UPDATE

Exciting things are happening in the CNC/Laser group. This group meets monthly prior to the general meeting from 8:30-9:30. We address CNC/laser related issues and also do a indepth show and tell on projects. Feel free to join us every month. We also do beginner training as well as advanced training on Vcarve software on Thursday mornings once a month. On the CNC side the group will again look at making a bulk order of CNCs and provide help in assemble and set up for those wanting to venture off into the CNC world. Look for more information on this in January. If you have any questions before that feel free to reach out to one of the 15 that got a CNC last year.

Gary Click has also agreed to do an info training class to 3D software design that he uses. It's a free software.

On the laser side.... the board approved the purchase of a 60w CO2 laser. This is similar to the laser that has been used making several of the signs and drawer tags at the guild and also engraving the panels on the new doors being built by the hand tool group. Special thanks to Linda Simcik and Henry Raymond for the door panel work. The laser will be a great asset to guild members to use to enhance their woodworking projects as well as making your own personal name tags to attach to your items you make. Several "Intro to laser engraving" classes are being planned for January and advanced laser operation classes will begin in early February.

#### HAND TOOL GROUP

- 2. Create the toy using wood of your choice.
- 3. Sand the toy. Please make sure the parts are well sanded since children of all ages will be playing with them.
- 4. Apply a finish of your choice. This should be child friendly.


