


### **About Us**

## **Toy Tip**

A piece of plastic about the size of a business card with a slot cut in it is a perfect spacer for toy wheels.

Slide the spacer between the vehicle and wheel for perfect amount of wheel clearance every time. This will also keep wheels from getting stuck to the vehicle body by mistake




