Toy Program

Traditionally, the November Guild meeting is when the toys made by the Guild members are turned over to Children's of Alabama (better known as Children's Hospital or just Children's). This year was no exception. The difference was, there were only two pickup truck loads of toys to be transported following the meeting. In 2013 there were so many toys made throughout the year there was not enough space to store them all at the WEC. So, we have been making trips to Children's every couple of months or so instead of saving all the toys until the November meeting. This works well for the Guild as well as for Children's.

The number of toys made has been increasing year after year and again, this year was no exception. In 2011 the Guild made 8,400 toys; in 2012 it was 14,500 - an all-time record. In 2013 the Guild produced 19,600 toys. This was a huge effort by many in the Guild, including Lee Beadles making over 900 toys in addition to sanding most all of the toys made by the Tuesday group. Cliff Daniels made over 300 and John Powell made more than 200. There are somewhere between 20 and 25 people in the Guild that have been involved in the toy making effort this year. Thanks to you all for the part you played in making this year successful.

In the past, Habitat has provided a substantial amount of wood to the toy program but because of reduced funding, they have shifted their emphasis from new construction to rehabilitating foreclosed-on houses for new home owners. This has reduced that amount of wood they have been able to supply to the toy group. However, several Guild members have stepped up to cover the shortage, either from their own shops or house construction sites in their neighborhoods or even from commercial woodworking shops. This has added to this year's success.

One other individual that has played a huge part, not only this year but for the past three years is Ralph Hardwick. Ralph has been the chairperson or the co-chairperson of the toy program for the past three years. This role requires a large time commitment on an almost weekly basis and Ralph has served his time well. Ralph has chosen to allow others to step into the leadership role for a while. As he leaves the leadership role others will work to fill his shoes. This will be a difficult task. Thanks, Ralph for all you have done for the toy program during your tenure.

Mentoring






