2014 Habitat for Humanity Holiday House Cabinet Class

Saturday, September 27th, a stack of material consisting of plywood, planks and stain sat on the floor of the Woodworking Education Center waiting to be crafted into kitchen cabinets and bathroom vanities destined for installation into Habitat for Humanity's 2014 Holiday House. For the eighth year, Guild Members signed up to learn and experience the joy of cabinet making from a top notch team of craftsmen over the next three months.

The journey began with a quick orientation, distribution of design plans and review of the construction steps for the project. Bob Moore and Randall Robertson led the class and shared experiences from tips and expectations to some of the "gotcha's" from previous classes.



The first weekend was devoted to the construction of the cabinet face frames. The class learned the basics of cut-list layout, planning, table saw safety and pocket hole joinery. Everyone in the class had the opportunity for hands on experience in each of the cutting and assembling steps including the always enjoyable surface preparation (a.k.a. sanding!).



The next weekend and step in the project was carcass construction. Brian Stauss and Cliff Daniels shared their talents and experience with the class in sizing the side panels, shelves and rails, as well as dado and rabbit joinery. The always advisable "dry fit" revealed the need for a nip here and tuck there before final assembly was performed.

Week three introduced the class to the famous (or infamous) dovetail joinery! While there are several schools of thought on hand cut versus jig created dovetails, the class for this project used a Porter Cable jig provided by Mike Key. Mike and fellow instructor Paul Mancill taught the class the finer points of setup with a focus towards attention to detail in order to have tight and strong joints on the drawer boxes.



It's week four (and college football is well under way!). It's now time to create the "character" of the cabinets - the doors and drawer fronts. John Lawson and Ray Ziegler brought their considerable expertise to the class and instructed on the art of constructing smooth rail and stile doors. Router basics and test cutting proved invaluable as the class created the twenty-four doors needed. Final assembly was again followed by that time honored, joyous tradition of surface preparation and this time with the added technique of hand planing!



The class was fortunate in week five, to have good sunny weather, even though it was a bit nippy outside. The class is now ready to add the "finishing" touches to the cabinets (sorry could not pass up the tongue in cheek!). Brian Stauss and Walter Barnett provided the instruction and the benefit of their HLVP (high-volume-low pressure) sprayers. After this session, this writer may never pick up a brush to add finish again! The weather held up and all of the cabinet parts were able to be finished and dried before the end of the day.

Having taken a couple of weekends off, the class was ready to convene again and attach the doors, drawers and pulls before the Thanksgiving Holiday rolled around. Bill Newman and Michael Malinicono led the way and provided wisdom and insight on aligning everything just right for smooth hardware operation. Experience-based techniques, tips and jigs made for a repeatable process assuring all the doors, drawers and pulls lined up when the cabinets were placed side by side - a critical point for when installation time comes in December!



The journey was almost over. The class has learned so much over the past several weeks and heartfelt thanks go out to all of the instructors for their time, patience and willingness to share their talents. The class has demonstrated the true purpose of the Guild: "...to promote and administer programs which will benefit the woodworking community and advance the art and craft of woodworking."

The cabinets are complete and ready for their own journey to the Holiday House!

Again, many thanks to the Guild Instructors and mentors for being so generous with your time and talent in bringing fledgling woodworkers along into the world of cabinetry!






