Box Building Class- April 25, 9am-4pm

Bill Newman will present a box building class on April 25, 2015 at the Woodworking Education Center. The class will focus on building a box with a floating panel top and bottom. Instruction will also cover the topics of mitered dovetails, box (finger) joints and veneered panel tops and bottoms. Bill will address basic woodworking principles such as, direct measurements, use of hand planes for final fitting, making trays with dividers, fabric linings for trays, mortising for butt hinges, glue-up clamping arrangements, sanding/ finishing, choice of finishes and several other topics.

The format of the class will be short lectures followed by demonstrations. Class participants will have opportunities to try some of the techniques. Bill will have several boxes in various stages of construction so that the complete process can be covered. The demonstrations will include; general design considerations, milling of the materials, re-sawing, grain matching, milling grooves and rabbets, cutting mitered corners, gluing up the basic box, separating the top and bottom of the box, and mortising for the hinges. After the class, a drawing will be held for the boxes. Those who receive the boxes will be requested to complete them after the class and bring them to "Show-and-Tell" at a Guild meeting.

If you would like to attend the class please let Bill know by email (nwkshop@gmail.com) or by telephone at 205-612-0543. Because Bill will be assembling materials and hand-outs, please let him know as soon as possible if you plan to attend. The fee for the class will be \$30 which you can pay on the day of the class.

April Pre-Meeting Mentoring Topic: How to Sharpen Scrapers

April's Mentoring Series Pre-Meeting will feature Bob Mooore. Bob will carry us down the trail of the effective but little known scraper. For smoothing boards with "normal" and "wild" grains, it's hard to beat a well edged scraper. Bob will demonstrate how to sharpen scrapers for the most effect as well as different types of scrapers and jigs. There will also be handson application of using the scrap-



Board selection is important to the structural integrity of the chest as well as joinery; after all, the woodworker's tools are/were his livelihood and need to be protected from both the elements and other envious woodworkers.







Chris carried the class along as he stepped through the build which included techniques, proper tool usage, bits of history here and there, all of which was peppered with humorous anecdotes and observations.



From I-65, take Exit 238 (Highway 31). Turn north on U.S. Highway 31, go 0.6 miles and turn left on State Highway 119 South. Go 3.0 miles south on Highway 119 and turn right on County Highway 12. Go 2.1 miles on Highway 12 until it ends at County Highway 17. Turn right on Highway 17 and the WEC is 0.3 miles on your left. There is a large WEC sign at the entrance.


