Seeing 2020

It goes without saying that 2020 has been a challenge in far more ways than most people could even have imagined. Looking forward to 2021, I am optimistic that the Alabama Woodworkers Guild will still be here and providing our members with opportunities to expand their own skills as well as sharing their expertise with others.

But we also must acknowledge that 2020 has limited the number of income streams we have: classes, tool sales, and membership dues from a shrinking member base. Therefore, we must be realistic when setting the budget for 2021 since we cannot be sure that operations will continue to be somewhat restricted for months to come. I am asking our membership for your help as well as sharing any ideas you may have. Please consider the following areas:

- Membership dues provide about 60% of our annual income. Due to the early closure of our shop, our membership roles have dropped. We have no plans to change our dues structure, so it is critically important that he have a handle on how many renewals we have for 2021. It is human nature to put off that renewal for next year (I certainly have done that). But if we could get a significant majority of members to renew before the end of the year, we would have a far better idea how to plan another challenging year. You can do so right now, and it costs you nothing to do so early although it helps the Guild when you do.
- Help us save money. There are a hundred ways you can do so like taking care of our equipment, making sure guides are aligned, or sanding belts are cleaned, or expendable supplies are replenished. If you take advantage of our supplies (like glue) being available, that is fine. But consider donating replacements next time you visit.
- Spread the word. We found we lost a few members when our shop was closed. But when asked, most of those former members were not aware that we had re-opened. Some of them re-joined. Help us not only encourage people to stay, but also spread the word that we are here. I have personally made it a point to talk up the Guild when the opportunity presents itself. This has resulted in several new members. If every member were to bring in one new member a year, our financial position would be far more solid.
- Get involved. It's easy to think of the Guild as a service you paid for. It is. But if you believe in our mission of spreading the knowledge of woodworking to the next generation, step up and help. You probably have unique skills that you could share in a mentor session. Even if you are brand new to woodworking, participate in classes or join one of our special interest groups. The more involved you are, the more value you get for your membership.
- Visit us online. Our website is getting better every day. And since the COVID lockdown, our YouTube channel has exploded. There are more and more resources being presented in an online format. We have elected to not hold in person monthly meetings until COVID resolves, but those meetings are available via Zoom. Even after operations resume normally, we plan to keep making the Zoom option available. Our technology committee has been working overtime to expand our online presence. If you have ideas for other ways to do so, please share.

Our Guild is strong. We are truly fortunate to have a large base of active members who step up and pitch in any time they are needed. But any group operating in today's reality must take any steps we can to help eliminate as many uncertainties as we can. Please renew now! Please get involved and spread the word!
